Globalteer Soccer Finals

The Globalteer Soccer Finals took place early this past March and TGC was proud to have our 18 and under girls team make it to the championships! It was a Sunday morning full of sweat and smiles, and although we lost in the semi-final round, the Grade 9 and 10 girls played with heart and enthusiasm, and were rewarded with a ribbon and certificate. Goals For Girls Leadership Training Course

Speaking of empowerment through sports, this spring brought about another exciting opportunity: A Goals for Girls Leadership Training Course. This course, which consists of 13 Sunday sessions over a 6-month period, is aimed at building young female leaders through soccer workshops and games. TGC was proud to send four of our girls to join with other NGO's across Siem Reap in this incredible initiative: *Teary, Kontea, Srey Khouch and Sokoam*. Their commitment and growth will culminate at this year's Globalteer Games in August, which they will be organizing and running. Additionally, upon completion of this program, these four students will receive a scholarship from Globalteer in the form of funding for a supplementary or extra-curricular class.

Karate Competition on Phnom Penh

On May 21 to 24 ten children from TGC were selected to travel to Phnom Penh for the Cambodia Karate Do Shotokang competition. The competition consisted of two kinds of exams: KATA

Performance and a 39 Technique Exam. There to watch the festivities were Oun Poan Monyroth, the minister of Economics and Finance, Soksinphanna, the adviser to the Prime Minister of Cambodia, and the Ambassador of Japan. Over 320 students competed from 23 clubs across the country and TGC did a phenomenal job among them, coming home with 3 gold medal winners, 2 silver medal winners, and 1 bronze medal winner! A special thanks to our TGC participants and Mr. Phearun, the Karate teacher, as well as Teacher Soben and Mum Pov, who helped facilitate the trip!



Partnership with the Women's Resource Center

In an effort to expand the current health program, TGC has begun a partnership with the Siem Reap Women's Resource Center (WRC). Thanks to hard work by Teacher Sam, the Global Child families now have the opportunity to team up with trained Khmer social workers to learn about a variety of health topics at no cost and in a safe environment. This program will be implemented in the form of

7 workshops, the themes of which will be selected by the family members themselves. In addition to two female-only workshops on Reproductive & Maternal Health and Understanding, there will be male and female combined workshops on Child Development & Need, Building Healthy Families, The Role of Parents, Positive Discipline and Healthy Mind and Body. New Building for TGC

TGC will be moving to a new building in December 2015. The move is necessary because the lease on the current buildings has expired and cannot be renewed. The new building is about 6,000

square feet, larger than the current school and Wood House combined, and will allow TGC to increase the number of students from the current 38 to about 50 during its first year. The building is located in Lok Ta Neuy, not far from the current school location. It is a brand new building and has never been occupied by any previous tenants. It was designed to be a guesthouse, so it has about 19 rooms, most with bathrooms and showers. It also has a large outdoor covered area and a spacious courtyard. We are so excited about this next step for The Global Child!

Artwork at Joe to Go


