CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) RESPONSE



Coronavirus (COVID-19) has tremendously impacted the way we live and how organizations operate on a day to day basis. Although the number of cases of COVID-19 in Cambodia remains low, we are doing our best to ensure that we are doing our part! During these unprecedented times, we are focusing on the safety and wellbeing of our students, staff, and community. As of mid-March, The Cambodian Ministry of Education issued immediate, indefinite closure of all schools within

Cambodia until further notice. As such, we have ceased all regular school activities and lessons, shifting to a distant learning format to counter the unfortunate danger that social interactions may impose on everyone.

EDUCATION

Safe Practices and Personal Protection

All of us have been working nonstop to ensure that students remain safe, healthy, and educated by establishing remote learning and teaching practices amidst COVID-19. Prior to the school



closures, we took measures to educate our stud

ent's parents on how to prevent the virus, preparing them for a potential outbreak in Siem Reap. In this, we held a workshop for the parents to teach them safe practices like hand washing and avoiding unnecessary travel, which was well received. In preparation for our students and staff to travel to their homes, Ms. Chhaylon taught our students how to make face masks. In order to ensure their safety and protection, each student and staff member was given a face mask, which they were told to wear if going out in public.

For the first few weeks of the shutdown, we were able to allow the dorms to stay open and classwork to continue in a typical fashion. Despite students that did not live at the school being asked to stay at home to keep everyone safe, we continued to have some students and staff live at the school. To continue our battle against COVID-19, we have promoted the use of safe practices such as hand washing, social distancing, and avoiding all unnecessary social contact and unessential outdoor travel. The students, with the help of Mr. Orn, successfully crafted two sinks for handwashing, now strategically placed in the parking lot and eating hall for use before entering the school and eating. Recently, students and staff were given hand soap and a towel for use at home to prevent the spread of this virus.



Remote Learning Breeds Creativity

The students and teachers are doing well and finding new ways to endure these tough and exceptional times. To stay busy and active during these times, students and teachers are participating in activities such as decorating the school and showing off their artistic skills. We have persuaded students and staff to draw on select walls of the school to depict their experiences at TGC and express their feelings through creativity. In order to ensure the students



do not fall out of learning or lose interest in school, we have prepared class materials for the students and their families to pick up at the front gate. Our staff has also

been training to pursue remote teaching, learning how to use new technologies and finding different ways to teach from a distance, allowing students to keep learning and even take exams! All the teachers have been working diligently to ensure that students continue to receive the education they deserve.

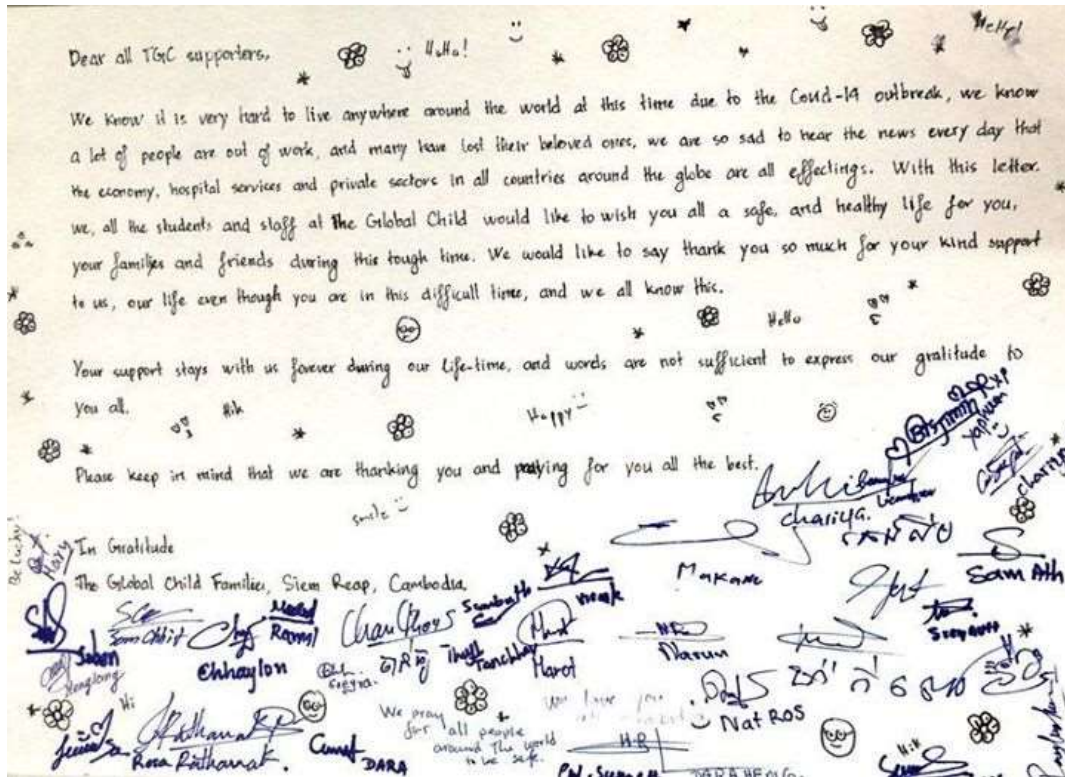
Lending a Helping Hand
